## THE ECOWAS FLOOD RESPONSE STORY ACROSS THE STATES

The ECOWAS Flood Response has successfully implemented distribution activities across 6 states in Nigeria, targeting the most affected areas following the devastating floods of 2022.

**Adamawa** state- The Nigerian Red Cross facilitated food distribution and borehole construction, benefiting approximately 1,000 households. Each household received essential food items, including rice, beans, and vegetable oil, alongside cash cards to assist with purchasing additional necessities.

**Anambra** State , 600 beneficiaries were supported through similar distributions, with a focus on providing food relief and reinforcing access to clean water through borehole construction.

In **Kebbi, Kogi, Oyo, and Rivers** states, additional distribution activities were carried out, encompassing food items, cash transfers, and water supply initiatives. The project reached a total of approximately 3,500 households, equating to about 21,000 individuals, by utilizing a variety of methodologies to meet identified needs.

Direct cash transfers were one of the strategies employed to provide immediate support, ensuring that beneficiaries could acquire food and other necessities according to their specific requirements. The project also focused on empowering communities through capacity-building workshops and support for vulnerable groups, including widows and persons living with disabilities, solidifying its commitment to creating more resilient communities amidst the ongoing recovery efforts.

#### COCA COLA FOUNDATION PARTNERS WITH NRCS. DISTRIBUTES CASH AND ITEMS TO 2100 FAMILIES.

Residents of Maiduguri, Nigeria woke up in September 2024 to the realization that 70% of the state capital had been submerged by floods.

According to the National Emergency Management Agency, the flood also ravaged other major city locations, including the palace of the Shehu of Borno, Umar Ibn Garbai El-Kanemi. In line with its philanthropic leaning the Coca Cola Foundation decided to help by donating \$400,000 to the victims of the deluge.

## #FloodResponse

In September 2024, devastating floods submerged over half of Maiduguri, Nigeria, causing significant loss of life and livelihoods. The disaster claimed 37 lives, injured over 50 people, and destroyed 7,000 homes, displacing more than 70% of the city's residents.

Farms were also submerged, worsening food insecurity in the region. In response, the Coca-Cola Foundation, in partnership with the Nigerian Red Cross Society, is providing \$400,000 worth of food, non-food items, and cash support to affected families.

Relief efforts will reach 2,100 families across 14 wards in Maiduguri, including Gwange, Bolori, Shehuri, Old Maiduguri, and Dusuman. Each family will receive essential food supplies, including 25kg of rice, beans, and corn, along with 5 liters of vegetable oil.

The Nigerian Red Cross Society, as the implementing partner, has ensured a rigorous selection process to identify the most vulnerable families in need of assistance.













### MOTHERS CLUBS: FIGHTING MALNUTRITION WITH THE NIGERIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY

The Nigerian Red Cross Society (NRCS) Mothers Clubs are at the forefront of the battle against severe acute malnutrition among children in Nigeria. Comprised of dedicated mothers, these clubs are driving community-based interventions to enhance child nutrition and health.

Mothers Clubs instrumental are in educating families about proper nutrition, breastfeeding, and balanced diets. They also teach mothers to recognize early signs malnutrition, of ensuring timely intervention. These clubs distribute nutrient-rich foods and supplements, and guide families on preparing nutritious meals using locally available ingredients.

Through regular health monitoring and close collaboration with local health services, the Mothers Clubs ensure that children receive necessary medical care and follow-up treatments. By involving the entire community, they create a supportive environment that empowers families to overcome malnutrition challenges. The efforts of the NRCS Mothers Clubs are vital in building healthier futures for children across Nigeria.

The IFRC is currently supporting Mothers Clubs in the BAY (Borno, Anamawa & Yobe) states to help tackle Severe Acute Malnutrition.



### **STORIES**

"Deploying as a National Disaster Response Team (NDRT) member to Maiduguri was an experience I won't forget. The city, overwhelmed devastating floods, had transformed into a landscape of stranded families and submerged homes. As we arrived, the urgency was palpable—families huddled on elevated ground, their lives upended overnight. Our mission was clear: provide immediate relief, assist evacuations. and essential supplies reached those in need. One unexpected challenge was the language barrier—many locals spoke Kanuri, a language I barely understood. It was frustrating at first 😥, but the incredible volunteers from the Nigerian Red Cross Society (NRCS) State branch stepped Borno translating and ensuring smooth communication. Their dedication was inspiring 6, proving that in times of crisis, solidarity and teamwork make difference. all the Despite the hardship, knowing we brought relief and hope to those affected made this deployment deeply rewarding."
